Costa Manzana (Apple Coast) is an island in the Caribbean. It is located 300 miles northeast of Costa Rica. It gets its name because *manzana* is the Spanish word for apple, and the island is shaped like an apple. It has many rivers and lakes, producing fertile land, especially in the "stem" of the island. There are many large rivers and lakes named after the founders and their children. River John is the island's main source of water. The water is taken directly out of the river and then filtered and distributed across the island. In the northwest corner of the island, there is a rainforest with many exotic species of animals. The mountain range is located in the southwestern corner of the island and provides bike trails for its visitors. It is an island surrounded by the Caribbean Sea and has many beaches. There are many highways that connect the major cities to the capital. In the "stem" of the island, there is a waterfall that attracts many tourists. The country's main source of income comes from its agriculture. There are many farmers who farm on the fertile land in the north. The country exports more than it imports because of the high amount of crops produced. Service jobs are the next highest field of work. Since education is highly valued, there are many teachers across the island. There are two main colleges on the island that educate people from all over the world. Many doctors and other hospital staff are employed at the many hospitals in Costa Manzana. The least amount of jobs are service jobs, but some people are still employed to mine gold and silver.

The country of Costa Manzana has a mixed economy. The president wanted everyone to be able to decide what job they would most enjoy and perform the best at. However, the

government is involved in determining regulations, such as minimum wage. This helps the country to be balanced and create equality. Glenjamin Engelmeyer retired from office at age 69 after many years of a dedicated and loving presidency. The country elected Kylie Primus, the daughter of John Primus, to take Glenjamin's place as president. She became the first female president of the island and made history.
